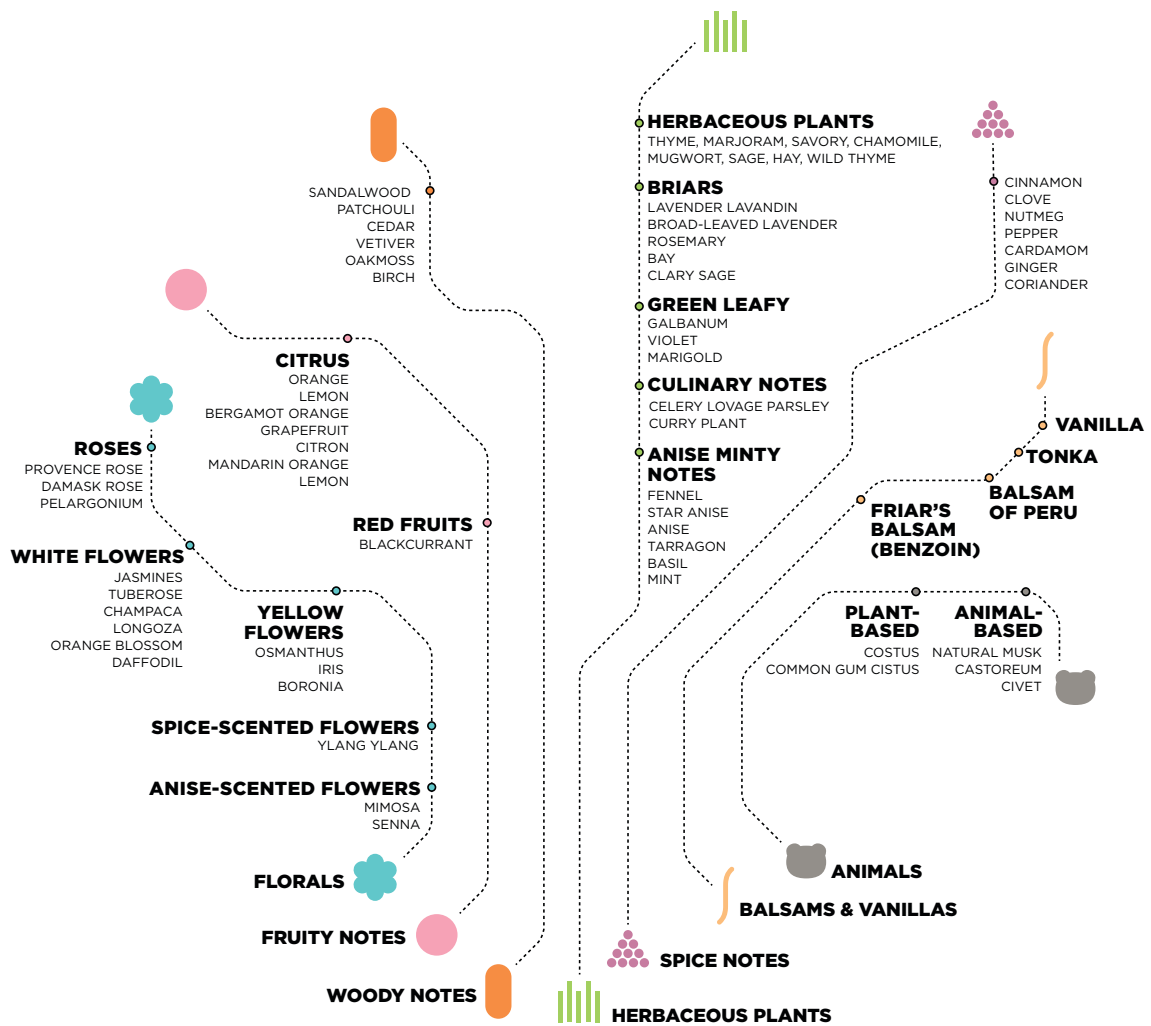


# Welcome

## to the Gardens of the International Perfume Museum

The Gardens of the International Perfume Museum have blossomed on former farmland where vines, olive trees and cereals were once cultivated. They have retained the natural beauty of this farming past, which earned them the **Remarkable Garden label awarded by the French Ministry of Culture in 2022.**

This 2.7 ha open-air museum welcomes visitors for **a unique olfactory and sensory experience.** It is home to botanical collections that have been graced with many new additions in recent years. There are two kinds of plant here: **perfume plants**, used to make perfumes, and **scented plants**, which are a source of inspiration for perfumers. They are grouped into olfactory families. **The tree diagram below shows a classification of the natural olfactory raw:**
